Rev. Dr. C. Anthony Hunt is a professor of practical, moral, and systematic theology at the Ecumenical Institute. He also serves as Senior Pastor of Epworth Chapel United Methodist Church and as a Superintendent in the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church.

Dr. Hunt earned his bachelor's degree from the University of Maryland, his M.B.A. from Troy State University, his M. Div. from Wesley Theological Seminary, his Certificate in Spirituality from St. Mary's Seminary & University, and both his D. Min. (Pastoral Theology) and his Ph.D. (Philosophical Theology) from the Graduate Theological Foundation.

Dr. Hunt joined the Ecumenical Institute faculty in 2000. He teaches courses such as Urban Ministries, The Church & the Civil Rights Movement, The Theology & Ethics of Bonhoeffer, Preaching in the Black Church Tradition, and The Life & Writings of Martin Luther King, Jr.
