PT/SP 602 Pastoral and Spiritual Care

Course Description:

A foundational course designed to help students to develop both a theoretical and practical basis for Christian caring with attention to practices of guiding, sustaining, healing, and reconciling.

Course Requirements:

- Students should expect to read <u>800</u> pages of required reading, inclusive of textbooks and handouts
- Students should expect to write *at most* <u>25</u> double-spaced pages. These will be comprised of the following:
 - 1. Reflection on your experience of receiving pastoral care (2-3 pp.) 10% of final grade
 - 2. Response paper to discovering your own spiritual type (2-3) 10% of final grade
 - 3. Scripture passage paper (7) 20% of final grade
 - 4. Reflection paper on your call as a pastoral care-giver (5-7) 20%
 - 5. Referral list (2-3) 10%
 - 6. Book review (2-3) 10%
- In addition to reading, writing and class participation, students should expect to produce or participate in these additional graded learning activities: class discussion (10%) and some inclass role play (10%).
