PT 601 Foundations of Christian Ministry

Course Description: A survey of the biblical, theological, and spiritual foundations of ministry, and an examination of the expressions of lay and ordained ministry in various Christian traditions.

Course Requirements:

- **Reading:** Students should expect to read at most 900 pages of required reading, including inclass handouts, and to come prepared to discuss readings in class.
- **Writing:** There will be four papers of moderate length interspersed throughout the course: a "call" paper outlining the student's call to ministry (2-4 pages, 10% of grade); a paper on faith development (5-7 pages, 20%); a paper on your denomination's view of ministry (8-10 pages, 30%); an interview with a leader from a tradition different from your own (8-10 pages, 30%).
- Other: Class participation, which includes short oral presentations of two of the papers, will count as 10% of grade.
