Prerequisites: TH601 or permission of instructor

Course Description: A study of sacramental theology, ecclesiology and relevant aspects of canon law for those who will engage in parish pastoral ministry

Course Requirements:

- Students should expect to read at most 750 pages of required reading.
- Students must attend the all-day workshops.
- Students should expect to write about 25 double-spaced pages, as follows:
 - 1. A brief statement of the most important theological claims about the church's sacramental system in the contemporary Catholic culture (2-3 pages), first draft by 6/27.
 - 2. A final project paper (not a research paper) pursuing a key ecclesiological question or issue raised by the course. This 15 page paper (double-spaced, 12-point) is a formal reflection paper incorporating course readings as well as class and workshop content.
 - 3. A paper (7 pages) on *either* how to prepare a couple for their wedding *or* how to prepare a bereaved family for a funeral.
 - 4. All work for the course is due by no later than July 22.
