### **PT601 Foundations of Ministry**

A survey of the biblical, theological, and spiritual foundations of ministry, and an examination of the expressions of lay and ordained ministry in various Christian traditions.

## **Course Requirements:**

- **Reading:** Students should expect to read at most 800 pages of required reading and should come prepared to discuss readings in class.
- Writing (no more than 30 pages):
  - o Reflection paper on one's own call to ministry 10% (1-2 pages);
  - o Book review (3-5 pages) and class discussion leadership on book -20%;
  - o Paper on one's own denominational understanding of ministry (10-12 pages) 30%;
  - Paper describing an interview and observation of a person in ministry (8-10 pages) 30%
- Other: Class contribution 10%
