# Course Name & Number: BS600 Orientation to Biblical Studies

## **Course Description**

This course will introduce students to academic tools and methods used to study the Bible, thus preparing students for future Bible courses and other theological study at the Ecumenical Institute. The course will focus on topics related to biblical study including: 1) the content and development of the biblical canon; 2) the transmission and growth of biblical literature; 3) methods and tools for biblical study; and 4) the exceptical process.
