Course Name & Number: SS806 Currents in New Testament Theology

Instructor: Dr. Michael J. Gorman

Course Description:

This seminar will consider some of the recent trends in the study of New Testament theology and spirituality/ethics. Special attention will be given to the themes of death and resurrection. The contributions of select Majority World scholars will be incorporated through articles.

Note: this is a course offered in the seminary for STL (Licentiate in Sacred Theology) students that is also open to 3T and 4T seminarians and EI students with appropriate background in NT studies, a 3.5 GPA, and the approval of the dean and the instructor. Maximum class size: 12.

Prerequisites: STL or CAS matriculation, or permission of the dean and instructor.

Course Requirements:

- **Reading:** Students should expect to read at most 1,100 pages (apart from research for the final paper), or approximately 100 pages/week, and should come prepared to discuss readings in class. (*Note: in addition to the books listed below, there will be several articles to read.*)
- Writing: Required writing assignments:
 - Weekly online post of about 100 words on a discussion board (15%)
 - One or two one-page, single-spaced discussion-starter papers (15-20%)
 - A final paper of approximately 4,000 words on one instructor-approved passage or theme in a particular NT writing, or on a comparison between two writings. This paper will be both analytical and constructive. (35-40%)

• Other:

- o Class participation (20%)
- Presentation on the final paper (10%). Note: this will take place during an extended session (approximately 1-5 p.m.) during exam week and will *not* be on Monday.
