**Course Number and Title:** H7003/MT703

**Class Meeting Days:** Saturdays (Class meets from 9:00 am-2:30 pm + weekly asynchronous work)

Meetings Dates: 5/21, 6/4, 6/11, 6/18, and 6/25

**Course Description:** A historical, theological, and socio-cultural analysis of the life and writings of Martin Luther King, Jr., with particular focus on the implications of King's work on the contemporary church and society.

**Course Requirements:**

- Attendance and participation in class are required. Assigned reading is to be completed before class sessions. (15 percent of grade)
- Students should expect to read *at most* 800 pages of required reading.
- Students should expect to write *at most* 24 double-spaced pages. These will be comprised of the following:
  - Complete two asynchronous online assignments, which will involve providing critical reflections (250 words) on two selected short films. (5 percent of grade)
  - Lead a 10–15-minute class discussion of one of the assigned readings. A written summary (1-2 pages, not to exceed 500 words) is to be provided for class participants on the day of the presentation. (10 percent of grade)
  - A personal reflection paper (6-7 pages, not to exceed 1750 words) on the relevance of Martin Luther King, Jr. to the student. (30 percent of grade)
  - A research paper (14-15 pages, not to exceed 3750 words) on some aspect of the life and ministry of Martin Luther King, Jr. (40 percent of grade)
